Material for a Service of Worship based on the
Christian Ecology Link **LOAF** Principles:
**Locally produced, Organically grown,
Animal friendly, Fairly traded.**

Our food says a lot about what matters to us. By our choices we can be responsible for harming the environment or restoring it. We can contribute to human and animal suffering or to their wellbeing. CEL's LOAF principles help people to reflect on choices they have previously taken for granted. In Britain the food chain is complex. A variety of environmentally friendly farming and marketing practices can be encouraged. It will take a while for our choices to make a difference. Meanwhile it will be difficult to follow all the LOAF principles all the time. We offer this worship material in the hope that participants will be able to affirm at least one of the LOAF principles.

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INTRODUCTION

“Jesus said, ‘I am the bread of life.
He who comes to me will never be hungry...’ ” (John 6:35)

HYMN Praise to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of creation.

Minister: Praise be to you, Sovereign God, Creator of all.
By your Word the universe came to be,
and through your Word
every living creature is nurtured and sustained.
We thank you for the fertility of the soil
and the harvest of the land;
we thank you for those who grow and provide our food,
both here and abroad,
and we thank you for those who sell it to us in their shops.
We confess that, in this network of productivity,
we have often allowed relationships
which should be good and mutually enriching,
to become destructive and exploitative.
You have given us Jesus, the Bread of Life,
and in you is our light and salvation.
As we celebrate your goodness
open our eyes, O God, to behold your presence amongst us
and strengthen our hands to do your will,
that the world, marred by our sin,
may know the peace and joy of your kingdom,
- the pure harvest that is at one with your will,
Father, Son and Holy Spirit:

All: Blessed be God for ever.

Minister: O be joyful in the Lord, all the earth;

**All: Serve the Lord with gladness
and come before his presence with a song.**

Minister: Know that the Lord is God;

All: It is he who has made us and we are his.

(Psalm 100)

PRAYER FOR FORGIVENESS

Minister: The LOAF principles urge us to eat what is Locally produced,
Organically grown, Animal friendly and Fairly traded. As we meet
to worship almighty God, the Father of all, we are conscious of
the many ways in which our food is tainted by sin. Let us confess
our sin, and the sins of our society.

ACT OF COMMITMENT (based on the LOAF principles):

(A few moments of silence are kept as the congregation prepares to stand and make this act of commitment. The congregation should be assured that one does not have to make a commitment to all four LOAF principles simultaneously. It is hoped that people will feel able to affirm at least one of them.)

Will you strive to live more simply,
to value food that is locally produced,
and to appreciate the regional varieties of the produce grown
here in this place to which God has called you?

With the help of God, we will.

Will you oppose the unnecessary pollution of the soil
and destruction of habitat for wildlife,
will you commit yourselves to explore the merits of organic food,
and will you endeavour, in whatever way you can,
to respect and care for the environment?

With the help of God, we will.

Will you combat cruelty to farm animals
and seek both to improve their conditions
and to promote their well-being?

With the help of God, we will.

Will you seek to serve Christ in one another,
rejecting the exploitation of the poor
and working for fairer trade
and a greater sharing of the blessings God has given us to enjoy?

With the help of God, we will.

(A large, locally baked, organic loaf of bread is brought forward and placed on the altar. The loaf is a reminder of the LOAF principles and of our dependence upon the Bread of Life. It is held by the minister whilst the following words are said:)

**All: God of Love, Bread of Life,
Saviour of the poor and weak,
receive with this loaf of bread
our gratitude for your goodness,
our penitence for our pride
and our dedication to your service in Jesus Christ our Lord.**

(The bread is broken and shared)

as we live in hope and anticipation of the world as it will be,
when your kingdom comes and your will is done.
Thank you for those, living and departed,
who have guided and inspired us
to reverence what you have made.
Help us to follow in their footsteps,
until, with them, we see you face to face,
where all is made new in Christ our Lord.
Merciful Father,
**Accept these prayers
for the sake of your Son,
our Saviour Jesus Christ.**

and needlessly destroyed the wildlife.
We have sinned:

All: forgive us and heal us.

Minister: We have inflicted upon farm animals
cruel and unnecessary suffering.
We have subjected them to cramped
and overcrowded conditions,
excessively long journeys,
and undignified, inhumane deaths at abattoirs.
We have sinned:

All: forgive us and heal us.

Minister: We have traded unfairly to our own advantage.
We have pursued our own prosperity
to the detriment of the poor,
and selfishly exploited the weak and vulnerable
within the world community.
We have sinned:

All: forgive us and heal us.

All: **Gracious Lord,
in our sin we have avoided your call
to further your kingdom of peace.
Our love for you is like the morning cloud,
like the dew that goes away early.
Have mercy on us;
deliver us from judgement;
bind up our wounds and revive us;
in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**
(cf Hosea 6)

Minister: May the God of love bring us back to himself,
forgive us our sins,
and assure us of his eternal love in Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
